Water Levels and Rainfall

February was yet another extremely mild winter month for 2017, yet it did yield some days of precipitation and thus continued to maintain the exceptional water levels that we have been grateful for. Many well water levels were still rising as they have been for months, but there was also a handful of wells that did go down. No changes in water levels either way were drastic by any means, mostly by only a few tenths. This month we received 1.21 inches of rain here at the office, which gives us 2.95 inches for the year so far. Last year we only had a mere .65 inches by the end of February! I am continuing to work on finalizing all of the 2016 data so very soon the water level graphs will be mailed out. Many people in the district begin to request that I collect and analyze well water samples around this time of year as it is free to all of those that live within the district, so please do not hesitate to give us a call and have us come out to sample your well water. I do not see rain in the forecast for the beginning of March but lets hope that we continue to receive rain and maintain good water levels.
