Winter wheat crops are being watered and some preseason watering for corn is going on at this time.

Water level trends are staying pretty steady. Runnels county had most of the water levels up from last year, but down from 2 years ago. Water levels in eastern Runnels were down from last month while water levels in western Runnels were up from last month.

Concho county saw water levels in the eastern half down from last year and down from 2 years ago. There was little change up or down in water levels in eastern Concho from last month. Western Concho county had water levels up from last year but down from 2 years ago. Water levels in the western Concho were down from last month by 5 foot or more in and around irrigated areas.

Tom Green county had water levels over most of the county that were up from last year but down from 2 years ago. North Concho river basin out to Grape Creek and past saw water levels that were down from last year and down from 2 years ago. The Mereta area saw water levels up from last month while the rest of Tom Green county saw water levels decline from last month.
