Well summer time is here and we are getting some short lived relief from the heat with scattered showers. Rainfall amounts are widely varied and often half a mile means the difference between a sprinkle and an inch or more of rain.

Water levels are almost all down all across the district. Concho and Runnels tended to just be down a foot or less in most wells. There are a few exceptions in and around irrigation wells.

Tom Green saw most of its water levels down 3 to 5 ft almost everywhere. In the heavy irrigation areas there were often drops of 6-9 ft or more.

We are going to see some record low levels next month and were already seeing a few this month. The best we can hope for is a hurricane or tropical wave that brings general heavy rainfall over most of the district.
