Water levels are not repeating the across the district rise that we saw last month. We needed another good general rain to make that happen. In most areas there have only been changes of a foot or two. Some wells were showing this as an increase and some as a decrease. This was due to the aquifers equalizing water levels from the areas of quick recharge to the areas with slow recharge.

In Tom Green county the areas recharged by Nine Mile creek and south of the Concho river east of San Angelo were showing steady gains. In Concho county areas recharged by the Kickapoo creek were also showing good increases in water levels. These gains may be short lived as more and more irrigation pumps are turned on to water the winter wheat crop.
