



September 2013

Our best rainfall month was September and it was not a drought breaker. Rain was scattered and most of the larger rainfall amounts were not in recharge areas for us. Irrigation has paused so levels are showing a rise, but pretty stable for now.

Concho county saw the largest rainfall amounts this month. Water levels were up from a year ago 1 to 3 ft. Levels were up from last month 1 to 3 ft. The exception was the Eola area which varied last month 3 ft down to a 10+ ft rise in water levels. East of Eola around Kickapoo creek levels near irrigated fields were all up over 10 ft from last month.

Runnels county water levels were steady with most wells varying within a foot up or down from last month and from levels last year. The exception was around irrigated fields which saw a range of water levels that varied 5+ feet up to 5+ feet lower both for last month and last year.

Tom Green county had mixed levels from last month but they were mostly up from last month by 2-10 ft. Water levels were way down from a year ago with most wells being 2-20+ ft below what they were a year ago.

Hopefully we will see more rain in October
